Minutes of the Meeting held on the 4th of February 2019

The meeting opened at 7.15 p.m.

3 To agree the minutes of the meeting of the 7th of January

The minutes were agreed and signed.

4 Matters arising from the minutes

Mr Hewitt reported a letter had been sent to Cranswick regarding traffic from Ash Tree Farm asking for a meeting.

5 Planning

2019/0172 Land to the rear of Pine Tree Cottage.

Concern was expressed over several aspects of the application including traffic and water issues. The clerk was asked to set out the PC's concerns in its response to the planning department.

A discussion about the merits of a single access and single exit at the junction of School Road with the A1066 followed.

6 Any Other Matters

Mr Hewitt was pleased to be able to point out that the notice boards and the Pillar Box Corner sign had been put up. Mr Neville asked about progress on bins for the A1066 and the clerk explained that he was in constant touch with Highways who were promising action soon.

Mr Kemp provided an estimate for a post and rail fence at the allotments which he felt was necessary. Mr Hewitt asked Ms Lanchester of the AA to make a case for the fence and suggested the matter be put on the agenda for the next meeting. Mr Kemp offered help to the plot-holder who was required to remove part of a poly tunnel by the end of March. Mr Hewitt made it clear it would have to be given as a private individual and not as a Parish Councillor.

Mr Hewitt read a copy of a letter sent to Richard Bacon regarding the GNLP. Dr McMurray suggested he be invited to a meeting to explain aspects of it. It was agreed that the possibility of a private briefing followed by a public meeting be considered but only after more information from the District Councillor.

The possibility of a Youth Parish Council was raised and Ms Lanchester agreed to provide information for the next meeting.
