3 To agree the Minutes of the meeting held on the 27th of September 2010

5 To consider a response to the planning application for duck rearing sheds at Fersfield

The proposed response drafted by Mr Cattermole and the Clerk, a copy of which had been distributed to members of the council, was discussed and a number of amendments agreed. The Clerk was asked to send the agreed letter and arrange a meeting with the planners at South Norfolk as soon as possible.

The meeting was closed to allow the public to speak.

A number of issues were raised including the urgency of action to oppose the application, increased traffic in the area, the unsuitability of the site for such a development, and the harmful effect on the village and its heritage with particular regard to the church. Councillors urged individuals who had approached environmental or heritage organisations which might oppose the plan to press the case.

The meeting finally closed at 8.25
